

Mandalay is perched on the Western Shelf of the Mountain and is a meticulously maintained garden bursting with mature, colourful tropical blooms.

Lush lawns compliment the vibrant flowers, and neat edges frame this paradise. Breathe in the fresh air and admire breathtaking western valleys.

This is a true connection to nature.



Harmony Gardens was established 46 years ago and is a refuge of mature beauty displaying the assortment of plants typically found in a mountain garden. The dense plantings provide hidden nooks and a secret forest walk.

The years of dedicated nurturing have resulted in towering camelias, swathes of clivias, agapanthus, golden bromeliads, and azaleas. Here, nature's melody reigns.



Beinn {Ben} Bield is a formal open garden. Long paths lead through manicured hedges and flowerbeds filled with hydrangeas, crepe myrtles, azaleas, and tibouchinas.

A tropical section features bromeliads and orchids. Lavender

borders the manicured main lawn. Large urns and ornaments, gravel gardens, and large mature trees beyond the boundary add grandeur to this mountain estate.



Petit Bijou is a true gem hidden from the street.

This is a traditional cottage garden bursting with poppies, foxglove, flowering shrubs and climbers, and many other colourful springtime favourites.

A selection of fragrant herbs and edible plants adds to the blend of beauty and bounty showcased in this delightful informal garden.



Dingle Dell is a shady haven for peaceful contemplation. Fountains supply a central rill that allows flowing water to divide this garden of secluded "rooms".


The rooms are defined by hedges and plant walkways weaving through the garden, creating a sense of discovery. Hidden fountains murmuring amidst the greenery add to the serenity of this garden.



The Haven is a true collector's paradise in a cottage garden, with an abundance of unusual specimens. Japanese maples, palms, and casuarinas that have stood for over a decade, their established forms providing a framework for the layers of meticulously chosen vibrant blooms. Camellias, magnolias, rhododendrons, and hellebores provide seasonal colour, mirrored in the understory of vireyas, clivias, azaleas, and a vibrant tapestry of annuals carpeting the ground.
